September 29th and 30th 2018, the Bolshoi Theatre Historic Stage – the first premiere of the 243rd season, the concert performance of the operetta in two acts Candide, staged by <u>Alexei Frandetti</u>, marking the 100th anniversary of the outstanding musician, composer and conductor <u>Leonard Bernstein</u> (August 25th 1918 — October 14th 1990).

Libretto by Richard Wilbur, based on the philosophical novel by Voltaire (1759) and the libretto by Hugh Wheeler (1971), with additional lyrics by Stephen Sondheim, John La Touche, Lillian Hellman, Dorothy Parker and Leonard Bernstein, with a narration for concert version by Leonard Bernstein and John Wells, edited and supplemented by Erik Haagensen.

Sung in English with Russian dialogs (translation by Ekaterina Baburina).

Orchestrations by Leonard Bernstein and Hershy Kay, musical continuity and additional orchestrations by John Mauceri.

Alexei Frandetti is the stage director of this piece by Bernstein, which is rarely performed in Russia, although it is one of the composer's most popular works, considered to be his best oeuvre.

This is what Tugan Sokhiev says about the new production: "/.../ First and foremost, Candide is a satire. It has many subtexts. When we turn to such great writers and philosophers as Voltaire, people in

each century can find something special in their work, something new and something relevant.

It is important to make sure that nowadays the music by Bernstein that accompanies the texts by Voltaire the prophet is still relevant and the modern audience can relate to it. We sing in English, so here is the question: can the modern audience hear and feel some subtexts in the melodies, as well as the humour, the irony, the sarcasm and serious, as well as lyrical elements that this piece has?".

The article Shall We Till Our Garden? tells more about the stage version of Candide at the Bolshoi Theatre and the anniversary of the conductor, the composer and the revolutionary musician Leonard Bernstein, which is being celebrated all over the world (the celebration is going to last for 2 years, from August 25th 2017 till August 25th 2019 on six continents; its programme includes over 3,000 events).

The dress rehearsal took place in the evening of September 28th . The press briefing started at 6 p.m.

The Bolshoi Theatre dedicated the performance of the ballet Don Quixote on September 22nd (at noon) to the People's Artist of Russia Vladimir Nikonov, a wonderful dancer (he was a Bolshoi Ballet dancer in 1957 – 1978) and a pedagogue-repetiteur (from 1980 until the present). On November 28th of last year Vladimir Nikonov celebrated his 80th birthday (the celebration was postponed due to the injury of David Motta Soares, the student of Nikonov, who is now making his debut with the part of Basilio and dedicates this debut to his pedagogue).

On September 20th the award ceremony took place at the Bolshoi Theatre Atrium. Culture and art workers received state prizes of Russian Federation, as well as Ministry of Culture awards.

The ceremony was held by the Minister of Culture Vladimir Medinsky, who recognised the achievements





On September 13th the Bolshoi closed its guest performances at La Scala; on October 8th and 9th the ballet company will present the production The Taming of the Shrew at the Latvian National Opera.

On October 17th and 18th the Bolshoi Opera and Orchestra will present guest performances of La Boheme by Giacomo Puccini at the Chelyabinsk State Academic Opera and Ballet Theatre named after Mikhail Glinka. The production staged by Federik Mirdita appeared at the Bolshoi in 1996 to mark the centenary of the opera's world premiere and was then performed for over 20 years (the last performance took place on June 22nd 2017). After the guest performances the Bolshoi Theatre will present the set, the props and the costumes to the Chelyabinsk Theatre. At the end of last year the Bolshoi signed an agreement on cooperation with the government of the Chelyabinsk Oblast; these guest performances will become the first project carried out as a part of this agreement.

The Bolshoi Theatre chief conductor and music director Tugan Sokhiev was a guest of the talk-show 2 Vernik 2 (the TV Channel Culture, on air on September 15th 11:40 p.m. — 12:35 a.m.).

The programme announcement says: "This is a meaningful and rather long conversation of an actor, a journalist and a musician, where the main character talks about the nuances of the conductor's profession in a surprisingly emotional way and with obvious pleasure. What was the road to success for the boy from Vladikavkaz? How did Sokhiev manage to become the music director of the Welsh National Opera at the age of 22? He talks about numerous engagements in the West, about a creative "conflict" with musicians, his uncompromising nature and about life at the Bolshoi Theatre, which is incredibly rich, diverse and goes on non-stop 24/7".

In 2018 the People's Artist of the USSR and Russian Federation Vladimir Vasiliev celebrates the 60th anniversary of the start of his creative career. To mark

this date, the TV channel Russia K presented 4 episodes of the programme Class of a Master. Vladimir Vasiliev (September 17th – 20th ). The portal Revizor reports: in October Voronezh will also mark the anniversary of the outstanding artist. The Voronezh State Opera and Ballet Theatre, which a big part of the master's creative career is connected with, will become the main venue for the celebration. Five productions by Vasiliev are performed at this theatre, where a large-scale ballet festival will take place from October 19th till October 27th 2018. On October 19th the festival will open with a three-hour production Ballet Masterpieces in Opera Classics to the music by Mikhail Glinka, Charles Gounod and Alexander Borodin.

The exhibition of paintings by Vladimir Vasiliev is now open at the village Ostrovskoe (Kostroma Oblast). Local mass media, including the source SMI44, report. The exhibition is open at the Boris Kustodiev Historical and Cultural Centre.

The magazine Ballet (No. 5, September-October 2018) reports about the 26th festival Benois de la Danse that took place on the Bolshoi Theatre Historic Stage in the beginning of June. This year the production team of the ballet Nureyev received prizes in almost all categories. Kirill Serebrennikov was awarded for his set for the ballet, Ilya Demutsky received the prize for his music, Yuri Posskohov – for his choreography and Vladislav Lantratov for his performance of the title role of Rudolph Nureyev.

The author arrives at the conclusion that sexual characteristic of this image, which it gains in films made after Perestroika, demonstrates the nostalgic mood of the society that grieves for everything that has been lost – the motherland, the values, the time".

Major mass media sources also report about the Bolshoi Theatre General Director Vladimir Urin taking part in the first meeting of the so-called Theatre Directors' Box and being elected the deputy chief of this association.

The event took place on September 24th at the mansion of the vodka magnate Pyotr Smirnov at Tverskoy Bulvar (architect – Fyodor Shekhtel). News agency Regnum announced: "The Theatre Directors' Box of Moscow theatre directors brings together directors of more than 80 theatres of federal and municipal subordination.

The main objective of the new association is to develop closer contacts between the heads of institutions, to create a unified theatrical communication environment, to transfer the traditions of theatre management to the younger generation and to support creative initiatives".

The TV channel Mir 24 reports: "The first meeting of the Theatre Directors' Box of Moscow theatre directors took place in Moscow. This is a new project that has been created in order to develop closer contacts among the heads of theatres. Besides, the box will also ensure the transfer of experience and theatre management traditions to the young generation, as well as support and promotion of creative initiatives. The first session was dedicated to the opening of the new season. The problems that theatres face today were discussed as well. The artistic director of the Moscow State Estrada Theatre Gennady Khazanov said: "Today we live in the context of the market economy, when it is much more difficult to attract the audience than to stage a production. Although staging a production is also not a piece of cake, let's be honest about that".

Eighty directors of theatres took place in the meeting. The head of Lenkom Theatre Mark Varshaver became the head of the box; the Bolshoi Theatre General Director Vladimir Urin was appointed as his deputy (The First Meeting of the Theatre Directors' Box Took Place in Moscow; went on air at 10:32 p.m. on September 24th).

The unique volunteer project <u>Discover the History of the Bolshoi</u> is carried out by the Bolshoi Theatre of Russia together with the company <u>ABBYY</u> (with the participation of KAMIS). It is the basis for the bright and informative article that the newspaper Vedomosti published (the article also has an ideological basis that is in line with the newspaper's philosophy and allows more fundamental study of the issue).

The source published 13 images. "What has been advertised in the Bolshoi Theatre's programmes and playbills over the period of more than 100 years: pledged money, elite alcohol and dentist service":

"Since the beginning of the 19th century theatrical programmes have had not only information about the upcoming productions, but also advertising. Volunteers of the project Discover the History of the Bolshoi digitised more than 48,000 posters and 120,000 pages of programmes for the electronic archive of the Bolshoi Theatre. The photo gallery features the most interesting ads from a period of more than 100 years.

Until the end of the 19th century, theatre programmes resembled newspapers. They were printed in the same circulation as posters that hung in the streets. The theatrical programme was a subscription, as well as newspapers. In the photo: the programme of 1865. The Bolshoi Theatre presents Faust and A Life for the Tsar, the programme features the advertising for the "Big Hotel Mir".

Other issues of the same year feature the automatic reply of the dentist Ludwig Adelheim to his clients that he wrote prior leaving for vacation: "The dentist Ludwig Adelgeym, on the Kuznetsky Most, in the village of Torletsky, has the honour to inform his patients about his departure abroad on December 23rd, from where he will return on January 15, 1865. Since during my absence there will be no patients, I inform those who need to see me that they welcome to contact me before the date mentioned above. On my arrival, a timely announcement will follow. "/ ... /

After the October Revolution advertisements disap-

peared from theatre programmes, but more attention was now paid their design. / ... /



The Italian online regional news publication Rimini Today (Italy) reports about the reopening of the Amitore Galli Theatre in Rimini on 28 October 2018 "Roberto Bolle will debut Saturday, November 3 - 8 pm — with an exceptional programme of Roberto Bolle and Friends" "a stellar programme that between late October and December, with special events, prose season and the Malatesta Festival, will see Cecilia Bartoli, Roberto Bolle, conductor Valerie Gergiev, Peppe and Toni Servillo, Svetlana Zakharova, and all the other great interpreters".

The Italian online news publication <u>Tiscali.it</u> (Italy) publishes a report from Askanews about a new photographic exhibition about the Bolshoi by Russian dance photographer Sila Avvakum was opened in the Italian city of Urbino. "The opening of the exhibition was also attended by the star of the Bolshoi Jacopo Tissi, fresh from his triumph at the Scala in Milan. The famous Bolshoi dance academy in Moscow had chosen Urbino for the third consecutive year of its summer courses".

The UK broadcaster ITV news (UK) publishes an article and broadcasts a video report by Arts Editor Nina Naar about a new documentary about Rudolf Nureyev titled Nureyev: All The World His Stage that includes previously unknown video footage of the dancer. "British filmmaker Jacqui Morris and her brother David were given access to 20 boxes of VHS tapes from the charitable organisation the Nureyev Foundation. But no one knew that footage of Nureyev that had never been seen before was on those tapes."

The Guardian (UK) newspaper publishes an obituary by Wendy Perron of Arthur Mitchell. "A star of New York City Ballet and the co-founder of Dance Theatre of Harlem, Arthur Mitchell was also the first African American principal dancer in any major ballet company. Mitchell, who has died aged 84, had classical lines, buoyant energy and a palpable joy in movement. In NYCB, where he danced from 1955 to 1968, he gained renown for two roles he created: the startlingly modernist Agon pas de deux, choreographed for him and Diana Adams by George Balanchine, and the mischievously bounding Puck in Balanchine's A Midsummer Night's Dream." Arthur Adam Mitchell, dancer, choreographer and artistic director, born 27 March 1934; died 19 September 2018.

—At the opening of the Metropolitan Opera season the singer performed the part of Abimélech, satrap of Gaza, in the opera Samson and Delilah by the French composer, pianist, organist and conductor Camille Saint-Saëns. This was a premiere. Libretto by Ferdinand Lemaire. Sir Mark Philip Elder, the British maestro and the music director of the Hallé Orchestra in Manchester, England, conducted the orchestra.

The performance was broadcast in Times Square in New York on several big screens. The transmission generated great from the public.

There will be eight more performances of Samson and Delilah starring Elchin Azizov at the Metropolitan Opera".

<u>Sputnik Azerbaijan</u> and the portal <u>Moscow-Baku</u> also report about the singer's performance.

The <u>TV Channel Russia Culture</u> reports about the season opening at the Metropolitan Opera (Culture News, went on air at 3 p.m. on September 25th):

"The Metropolitan Opera opened the new season with the premiere of Samson and Delilah. This opera by Camille Saint-Saens is based on the Old Testament legend of the mighty hero and the beautiful Philistine girl who betrayed him.

"Emotionally, psychologically and even physically, the relationship between Samson and Dalilah is destructive for them. Nevertheless, they draw strength from this mutual attraction, "—said the singer Elina Garanča.

Staged by the Tony Award-winning director Darko Tresnjak, for whom this has been the first experience

of working on an opera production. He staged the biblical story in such a way that both ancient motives and modern ones are easy to notice. Conductor — the British maestro Mark Elder, who has returned to the Metropolitan 20 years later. The cast stars the world-famous Roberto Alagna and Elina Garanča."

Radio Orpheus reports: "This production will be broadcast in the cinemas around the world in October".





In early December, Diana awaits an event, which she compares with the birth of a child. On the stage of the Adrienne Arsht Center in Miami, she will perform in the production Sleeping Beauty Dreams. She says: "It is the first time that I am taking part in such large-scale project. A huge team from all over the world is working on it: these are people who have never worked together, but each of them is the brightest star in their field of contemporary art. / ... / This will be an experimental project that combines music, dance, contemporary art and 3D technologies — we, with the creative producer Rem Haars, define the genre as contemporary art performance. The Russian premiere of the documentary film Nureyev: All The World His Stage took place on Septem-

ber 29th in Moscow at the KARO cinema October 11 and on September 30th in St. Petersburg at the Aurora cinema. After the screenings discussions with the authors took place: the film directors, nominees for the BAFTA award Jackie and David Morris came to the premiere together with the producer of the film Trevor Beatty.

The street tablet exhibition The Genius of the Stage, marking to the 70th birthday of Mikhail Baryshnikov, opened at the Kirov Central Park of Culture and Leisure in St. Petersburg on September 24th. The exhibition features photo materials and documents provided by the State Archives of Literature and Art of St. Petersburg. It is located on the Upper Alley near the Pristani (to the right from 2nd Elagin Bridge) and will run until November 20th., Ekaterina Baburina (Muzykal'noe Obozrenie) writes about the results of the 24th Golden Mask Festival in her article Hard to Be a Golden Mask.

In 2018 the Bolshoi Theatre received three Golden Mask awards – for the best opera production (Billy Budd by Benjamin Britten, conductor – William Lacey, stage director – David Alden), the best designer in musical theatre (Paul Stainberg was recognised for his sets for the same production) and the best actress in ballet/contemporary dance (Anastasia Stashkevich for the part of Novice in the ballet The Cage by Jerome Robbins to the music by Igor Stravinsky). The musical theatre jury awarded its special prize to the "unique creative duet in the Bolshoi Theatre production of Manon Lescaut" – Anna Netrebko and Yusif Eyvazov.

Azerbaijani media reported that a People's Artist of Russia and pedagogue-repetiteur Mark Peretokin would give master-classes for the ballet company of the Azerbaijan State Opera and Ballet Theatre in Baku.

According to <u>Sputnik</u> Azerbaijan, master-classes will be held from October 1st to October 31st. In addition, Mr. Peretokin will work with the leading soloists of the ballet, honing their skills in the performance of their parts in classical ballet performances.

On September 25th 2018 the Saint Petersburg premiere of 24 piano preludes Songs of Bukovina by Leonid Desyatnikov took place at the <u>Saint Petersburg Philharmonic Small Hall</u>.

<u>ClassicalMusicNews.ru</u> reports: Alexei Goribol, to whom the cycle is dedicated, performed the pieces at the premiere. The programme of the concert also included 24 piano preludes by Dmitri Shostakovich, performed by Polina Osetinskaya

Leonid Desyatnikov admitted that Shostakovich's cycle served as a guide for him as he was composing his preludes; the second source of inspiration was the folklore of Bukovina. "At the heart of each of the 24 preludes is a genuine folk tune. Sometimes it is very much changed, but sometimes it is there almost in its pure form, " — noted the composer.

About a year ago the premiere of the ballet Songs of Bukovina, staged by Alexei Ratmansky to the music of 12 preludes, took place in New York; later some of those preludes were also performed in London and Voronezh.

The cycle was first performed at the Diaghilev Festival in Perm in June 2018"

The exhibition Bolshoi Ballet in the Library is open at the <u>Russian State Library of Arts</u> until the end of 2018.

For many years the collections of books in the Russian State Library of Arts were being explored by researchers of ballet art Yuri Slonimsky and Vera Krasovskaya, ballet masters Leonid Yakobson and Alexei Chichinadze, ballerinas Marina Semyonova and Maya Plisetskaya. As the exhibition demonstrates, the same collections are now being used by Vladimir Vasiliev and Boris Akimov, Yuri Grigorovich and Andris Liepa. The famous designers Sergei Barkhin, Victor Volsky and Boris Messerer created their costumes at the Library; now their sketches are exhibited at the Russian State Library of Arts Reader Museum.

On September 21st and 22nd the impresario Sergei Danilian presented the Russian premiere of the production Isadora to the music of the ballet Cinderella by Sergei Prokofiev, choreographed by Vladimir Varnava and starring Natalia Osipova as the great dancer of the beginning of the 20th century.

The Saint Petersburg State Museum of Theatre and Musical Art celebrates the double anniversary the 100th anniversary of the founding and the 110th anniversary of the collection, which was started by the First Russian Theatre Exhibition in 1908. The exhibition 100+10 opened at Sheremetyevo Palace. It features new acquisitions and gifts to the museum over the past ten years.

Elizaveta Avdoshina (Nezavisimaya Gazeta) reports about the exhibition that will run until January 23rd, 2019.

The Art News Paper Russia reviews the exhibition:

"The new exhibits include glove dolls, which concert brigades used when they toured the hospitals during the Great Patriotic War, archives of Serge Lifar and ballerina Illaria Ladra, old musical instruments and costumes designed by Pierre Cardin for Maya Plisetskaya. Mikhail Baryshnikov presented to the museum the beret of Rudolf Nureyev and 39 drawings by Sergei Sudeikin — sketches of costumes for the opera The Fair at Sorochyntsi, staged at the Metropolitan Opera in 1930. Perhaps the most valuable exhibit is a unique collection of theatre graphics that has more than 800 sheets. This is the collection of Nina and Nikita Lobanov-Rostovsky, bought from the owners and donated to the museum by the Konstantinovsky Foundation. Recently, 62 more works were added to it — a personal gift from Nina Lobanova-Rostovskava. This collection takes up the whole hall, though it is not as big as the one where Plisetskaya's costumes are exhibited.


