The choir of the Bolshoi Theatre was awarded the prestigious musical prize of the Best Opera Choir of 2019 at the International Opera Awards. The awards ceremony took place at Sadler's Wells Theatre in London on April 29.

National Artist of Russia, Chief Chorus Master <u>Valery Borisov</u> accepted the prize.

The choirs of De Nederlandse Opera, Opéra de Lyon, Covent Garden Royal Opera, Dresdner Staatsoper and La Scala were also nominated forThe Best Opera Choir award.

The Bolshoi guest soloist, Merited Artist of Russia, National Artist of Tatarstan <u>Albina Shagimuratova</u> entered the prize list as the performer of the main role in the opera Semiramide by Giacomo Rossini was selected as The Best Opera Recording.

Russian winners of this year's prize also included conductor Maxim Yemelyanychev (The Best Novice) and soprano <u>Asmik Grigorian</u>, who was awarded for the second time (first time she was awarded the prize for The Singer of the Year in 2016).

Katie Mitchell was named The Best Opera Director.

The gong For Contribution To Art was given to the legendary American opera singer (soprano) Leontyne Price.

Evgeny Onegin returns to the Historic Stage replacing <u>the production that ran on the New Stage</u> (September 1, 2006 — May 17, 2017), a production by Dmitri Tcharniakov than caused a lot of interest and discussion within the audience and was shown in many countries (at the Paris Opera, at La Scala in Italy, at Covent Garden in England, during tours in China, Greece, Slovenia).

Tchaikovsky's opera was staged at the Bolshoi 11 times and survived two scenic versions.

The first performance was on January 11, 1881 (conductor — Enrico Modesto Bevignani). The second one, in 1895, was conducted by Sergei Rakhmaninov.



The list was continued with contemporary masters including Ulyana Lopatkina, Nikolai Tsiskaridze, Svetlana Zakharova, Diana Vishneva, Natalia Osipova, Ivan Vasiliev and many other dance professionals.

This year Soul of Dance has nine nomination categories: The Star, the Star of Ballroom Dance, the Star of Contemporary Dance, the Star of Folk Dance, the Rising Star, Maitre of Dance, the Teacher, the Knight of Dance and the Press Leader.

New productions of the Bolshoi continue to attract media attention.

"Two main Moscow theatres held press conferences where their heads announced repertoire plans for the next season. Tatiana Kuznetsova and Sergei Khodnev discuss the information," <u>Kommersant</u> reports (The Fight for Repertoire: The Bolshoi Theatre And MAMT Announced Their Plans For The Season 2019/20).

"Between them it makes more than 20 premieres: ballets, operas and concert programmes," Maria Bab-

alova tells <u>Evening Moscow</u>. "The most important events are Sadko in Theatre Square and Don Quixote in Bolshaya Dmitrovka. ...

The Bolshoi keeps presenting concert versions of operas under its chief conductor Tugan Sokhiev. Two titles are at play — Mazepa by Tchaikovsky, an opera in a contemporary setting with corresponding political context. There will be also a concert version of Anne Boleyn by Donizetti, that will join both theatres since the main role will be sung by Khibla Gerzmava..."

"The Golden Mask 2019 has summed up the results -<u>Ekran I Stsena</u>". "The biggest number of (ballet) awards was given to the Bolshoi Theatre/ ... Main prizes — The Best Choreography and The Best Ballet Production also went to the Bolshoi/ Or, more precisely, remained at the Bolshoi since the 25th ceremony was held on its Historic Stage. We cannot say than the ballet Nureyev has received its awards due to diplomatic reasons. The powerful performance with beautiful choreography and stunningly expressive duets and solos has definitely deserved that yield of awards."


Dance Festival Svetlana was supposed to become an annual vent and it looks like nothing else that is held in Russia. According to Zakharova, she "wanted to combine different genres and lines of choreographic art," give children an opportunity to present themselves and meet other dance groups of the country.

On May 5 in Italy, at Teatro Comunale Luciano Pavarotti the Bolshoi prima and La Scala etoile Svetlana Zakharova presented her new programme with a single ballet <u>Mademoiselle/Chanel</u> by Ilya Demutsky in choreography by Yuri Possokhov and a ballet divertisement from other choreographic productions.

Svetlana Zakharova's premieres evening <u>Modanse</u> will take place at the Historic Stage on June 22 and 23.

The Bolshoi leading soloist Igor Tsvirko gave an interview to <u>GQ</u>: "I need chaos, need to run somewhere, to hurry" and had his pictures taken for the magazine photo gallery. Tsvirko told how he left Russia in 2018 for Budapest to work at Hungarian National Ballet and why there in Budapest he missed the Bolshoi and the fast pace of Moscow, how those artists leaving Russia feel, and compared today's situation in ballet with the one in the time of Nureyev and Baryshnikov.

Dance. Emotion. Body Movement — <u>La Personne</u> offers a special project for the Day of the Dance with participation of the Bolshoi soloist Artemy Belyakov: When we speak about ballet artists we imagine an unearthly creature that mastered the perfection of the body via everyday toil and a stubborn mind. Their body is an impossible ideal, their dancing is a dream."

# In brief

On April 29, the International Day of the Dance, Zizi Jeanmaire turned 95.

Zizi Jeanmaire is an outstanding ballerina. The muse of Roland Petit.

Carmen, one of her most remarkable roles in ballet art of the 20th century, was staged for her. On the London premiere in 1949 the ovation lasted for 40 minutes.

Having graduated from the Grand Opera ballet school, she owed much to Russian tutors, too, with whom she trained on her own, first of all to Boris Knyazev (Yvette Chauviré brought her to him). Zizi Jeanmaire left the Opera early and started her personal career. Serge Lifar staged for her in Les Ballets Nouveaux de Monte-Carlo. She worked in Hollywood. Howard Hughes was in love with her. She filmed in Hans Christian Andersen and Folies Bergère. Christian Dior and Ives Saint Laurent created costumes for her.

The muse and wife of Roland Petit she was the star of virtually all his ballets and shows. He staged amazing revues for her. In the 50s she started singing at his urging. Cosma, Prévert, Serge Gainsbourg wrote for her. Petit, Nureyev, Baryshnikov and many others were her partners. She was considered to have the most beautiful legs. Her plastique, her peculiar style, her wit combined with a slightly raspy voice and heartfelt performance of such songs as Cherry Time, We'll Fall Asleep Together, Diamond Devouresse made her the icon of her generation. Millions adored her.

After her husband passing away she lives in Switzerland.

She wrote a book and a memoir.

The actress' birthday is marked by <u>Le Figaro</u> and many publications in media and social media.

The premiere of Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk by Shostakovich staged by Krzysztof Warlikowski took place at Opera Bastille in Paris, Alexei Tarkhanov of <u>Kommersant</u> reports.
