On June 13 14, 15 and 16 the Bolshoi Theatre presented the premiere of the one act-ballets programme of Symphony in C and Gaîté Parisienne.

Symphony in C by George Balanchine to music by Georges Bizet was first performed at Paris State Opera on July 28, 1947. The Bolshoi premiere was on April 21, 1999. Now after a nine year break Balanchine's masterpiece returns to the Bolshoi Stage. The revival was prepared in cooperation with George Balanchine Foundation and conforms to Balanchine standards of style and technique set and provided by the Foundation.

For the first time the Bolshoi turns to works by Maurice Bejart, a legend of contemporary ballet, and presents one of his most cheerful productions — the autobiographical ballet <u>Gaîté Parisienne</u> to music by Jacques Offenbach and Manuel Rosenthal.

The world premiere took place on January 27, 1978, at La Monnaie Royal Theatre in Brussels.

"The project evokes rem iniscences of youth in me, of my first coming to Paris," — Maurice Bejart said about his ballet.

One of the ballet's authors, the famous set and costume designer Thierry Bosquet worked on the Russian premiere of Gaîté Parisienne; One of the choreographer's associates, former soloist of the Ballet of the 20th Century and Bejart Ballet Lausanne Pyotr Nardelli and ballet mistress, the artistic director assistant Nasuno Keisuke revived the choreography. On May 5 Vladimir Putin and Xi Jinping attended the gala event held at the Bolshoi Theatre marking the 70th anniversary of the establishing of Russian-Chinese diplomatic relations. At the Historic Stage there were Pyatnitsky State Academic Russian Folk Orchestra and Chinese Central Traditional Orchestra. Before the concert, the heads of the two states visited a photo exhibition arranged by Russian and Chinese news agencies TASS and Xinhua at the Bolshoi foyer. The photos featured the key events of last 70 years.

"It was very pleasant to be together with Vladimir Putin at the Bolshoi, one of the oldest and the most famous theatres in the world. 70 years ago, Chairman Mao Zedong visited the USSR and the famous Bolshoi Theatre for the first time and witnessed the opening of a new page in the history of Chinese-Soviet friendship. And today we gathered here again to celebrate the 70th anniversary of establishing Russian-Chinese diplomatic relations and witnessed another landmark moment in the chronicles of the Russian-Chinese relationship," Xi Jinping said.

Guzel Sharipova (Bolshoi Theatre), Sergei Kuzmin (Mikhailovsky Theatre), Vladimir Dmitruk (Stanislavsky Music Theatre) and Artur Kaipkulov (Bashkir Opera and Ballet Theatre) performed arias and fragments from operas by Rimski-Korsakov, Bizet, Gounod, Verdi, Donizetti, under the baton of Anton Grishanin.

After the concert the Bolshoi soloist Guzel Sharipova was solemnly awarded the diploma of Artist of Radio Russia. The Radio Rossia music commentator Olga Rusanova was the host of the evening.

The prize was established in 2016, it's main prupose is informational support and project monitoring of young talented artists for 3 years. Dilyara Idrisova was the first winner of the prize. In 2017 the prize was given to Sergei Kuzmin, in 2018 — to Vasilisa Berzhanskaya, Vladimir Dmitruk and Artur Kaipkulov.

World ballet star Julio Bocca (Argentina) gave morning classes at the Bolshoi from May 28 to June 9. In 1985 he won the 1st prize and the Golden Medal of the Moscow International Ballet Contest. His victory immediately attracted the attention of the world ballet community, and Mikhail Baryshnikov, the artistic director of the American Ballet Theatre of that time, accepted the 18-year-old artist into the company as a soloist right away. The prominent tutor Azari Plisetsky also gave classes form May 30 to June 14.



Elizaveta Kokoreva: "The stage of the Bolshoi is very special, it has become a lucky place for me. I won two big ballet competitions on this stage: The 12th International Ballet Contest in 2017 and the Russian Ballet contest this year. I first appeared on this stage in a gala concert at the opening of the Historic Stage."

The latest issue of <u>Kommersant. Weekend</u> announces the one-act ballet premiere evening Symphony in C and Gaîté Parisienne "The Bolshoi is the first theatre in Russia to stage the works by Maurice Bejart. To tell the truth, these are not indisputable masterpieces: Makhar Vaziev has chosen Gaîté Parisienne which the choreographer created in 1978 to music by Offenbach and Rosenthal. … Symphony in C had been already shown at the Bolshoi 20 years ago. This genius choreography

showed the company as a cheerful, vigorous and talented team, and opened a new era in the history of the country's chief theatre. Symphony in C is being revived after a long break with different performers and in a different historical context. The premiere will show what its role is this time."

<u>Kultura newspaper</u> publishes an interview with ballet-master Pyotr Nardelli who works on Gaîté Parisienne with the Bolshoi artists.

Kultura: "You used to dance in Gaîté Parisienne yourself, didn't you?"

Nardelli: "One of Bim's friends, dreamed of the role of Offenbach yet it failed to be."

Kultura: "How do you remember Bejart?"

Nardelli: "Incredibly intelligent. Probably, it was in his genes — he was the son of the renowned philosopher Gaston Breger. Bejart devoted all his time free of dance creation to reading and listening to music. He 'swallowed' a book a day, went in for old movies — he knew them by heart. Now choreographers consider themselves creative and successful creating one ballet in a year. Bejart used to issue 5-6 productions in a season, working in several directions at a time. He staged to oriental music in the morning, went to another room in the afternoon and worked with contemporary melodies by Boulez, and in the third — there played Verdi or Puccini. The same day. His efficiency, switchover capability and mental processing were stunning.' ... A pdf copy of the Kultura newspaper is available on the link, pp.10-11.

Professor Dmitry Vdovin told <u>NEWSmuz.com</u> online publication about the German part of the Bolshoi Youth Opera Program. The YOP members not only sang their parts in German (May 28 and 30) but created their characters' personalities that belong to that very German Culture. It was a very difficult task and brilliantly performed," the author of the article and interview Lyudmila Krasnova writes. Dmitry Vdovin: "Any singer shall be ready for German opera classics!"

"What is your addressing of German opera classics in the work of the Bolshoi YOP based on?"

"One of the main tasks of our Program is the integrated development of young artists, singers and pianists. Flexible repertoire and and style precision are integral parts of this complex. Regardless the fate of an artist, his joining a company or choosing the path of a freelancer, they shall be ready to work with the main elements of the world opera legacy. And these are (besides our national repertoire that it is only fitting to master) Italian, French and German operas. There are also Czech and English ones yet they are a bit off mainstream. /./"

Muzykalnaya Zhizn magazine (May 2019) publishes a vast and richly illustrated interview with the Bolshoi Ballet prima Svetlana Zakharova. The ballerina's photo is also featured on the magazine cover.

Former director of the Bolshoi Anatoly Iksanov gave his first interview since retiring in 2013. He told Forbes magazine about how the theatre has chaged since the beginning of 2000s and what was the purpose of involving private business in the theatre's funding. Yana Zhilyaeva speaks: "Iksanov, the Bolshoi Director General in 2000-2013, was the first to introduce the concept of fund-raising in the Russian theatre community. In 1994 he founded the first in post-Soviet Russia board of trus-

tees and theatre fund at the Bolshoi Drama Theatre in St-Petersburg and then at the Bolshoi in Moscow.

"How did you engage big business in theatre and return the Bolshoi into the list of the international stage trend-setters? It was during your tenure that the ballets and operas which became world-class artistic breakthroughs were staged. You invited director Dmitri Tcherniakov and choreographer Alexei Ratmansky,

composer Leonid Desyatnikov and librettist Vladimir Sorokin to the Bolshoi.

"A theatre's development is impossible without repertoire renovation. Thus performances turnover is an objective necessity. Returning the Bolshoi to the international theatre elite was a circumspect development strategy with multi-directional and sometimes offbeat moves. As a director my primary task was to create a sound financial base, to find resources that would allow the theatre to complete a quality repertoire with a proper level of directors and performers. /./"






