February 14, the Historic Stage — the premiere of the opera by Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov Sadko, production by Dmitri Tcherniakov.

Having staged The Tale Of Tsar Saltan at the New Stage in the beginning of the 244th season, the Bolshoi goes on with the premiere of Sadko. This opera was staged for the first time at the Bolshoi in 1902 directed by Vyacheslav Suk (the production featured Antonina Nezhdanova as Volkhova, Anton Bonachich as Sadko and Feodor Chaliapin as Varangian merchant.) Since then the Bolshoi has turned to Sadko many times – in 1930, 1934, 1935, 1938, 1949 and in 1976 when the production was timed to coincide with the theatre's 200th anniversary, with Vladimir Atlantov as Sadko (conductor - Yuri Simonov, director - Boris Pokrovsky, set designer - Fyodor Fedorovsky.) The last time the Bolshoi heard the masterpiece by Rimsky-Korsakov was in February 1984 - 36 years ago.

The world renowned Russian opera director Dmitri Tcherniakov has a special relationship with Rimsky-Korsakov's legacy in recent years the director has staged four operas of the composer in theatres all over the world: The Invisible City of Kitesh (2001), The Tsar's Bride (2013), The Snowmaiden (2017), The Tale of Tsar Saltan (2019).

His loyal team helped Tcherniakov to fulfill his creative idea.



On February 25 in Kaliningrad the ground breaking ceremony for the future branch of the Bolshoi; the construction is scheduled to finish in 2023.

The Bolshoi will also give a gala at the Amber Hall in Svetlogorsk on February 25 (Kaliningrad Region). The Bolshoi Orchestra, Choir, Opera and Ballet soloists will come on tour.





The Bolshoi CEO Vladimir Urin – the hero of the programme Once Upon A Time... on the <u>NTV channel</u>

An interview with the Bolshoi CEO Vladimir Urin — The Big Man of the Bolshoi Vladimir Urin — in the pro-

gramme Once Upon A Time... on the $\underline{\text{NTV}}$ channel on February 2.

"Today he rules the giant empire of the Bolshoi Theatre: 50 real estate objects and 3200 theatre workers. In the new edition of the programme, Vladimir Urin remembered his first meeting with Maya Plisetskaya, spoke about the Bolshoi, about the power, and answered questions about why his best recollections are from his post-war childhood, who he still addresses in no other way than 'maestro', what work has turned into a hobby, and what in fact makes sense of his life."

The Bolshoi director General Vladimir Urin gave a video interview (03'56") to Rossia-Kultura channel: (Culture News, the air of February 10, 23:40):

"Theatre professionals of Russia have come forward with an initiative to create a monument to Marius Petipa. It will be set in Marseilles, the choreographer's native city. Authors of the monument are sculptor Andrei Korobtsov and architect Konstantin Fomin. Early works are already completed."

On February 12 Kommersant newspaper dedicated a special printed edition — a four-page review — to the premiere of Sadko at the Bolshoi.

On the eve of the premiere, the production's director Dmitri Tcherniakov told <u>Kommersant</u> about his attitude to fabulousness in operas, about Rimsky-Korsakov's scores, and how to find a theatrical approach to it today. The extensive interview was published under the title "I Always Wanted A Human Story On Stage."

Participants of the premiere speak about their roles in the "opera-legend" — <u>"Our Sadko is a modern man."</u>. How the visual imagery of Dmitri Tcherniakov's new production works – in the article <u>Old Artists for New Sadko</u>.

On Dmitri Tcherniakov is returning to the Bolshoi with the production of Sadko – <u>Kommersant Weekly</u>: "The previous production at the Bolshoi of the most renowned Russian opera director Dmitri Tcherniakov was presented almost nine years ago – Ruslan and Lyudmila was the first premiere after reconstruction of the main building and the first clamorous scandal in its new history. Some people were overly sensitive about the transformation of Pushkin-Glinka's tale of maidens and knights into a hi-tech idyll 'a la russe. One can only be happy about Tcherniakov's return to the Bolshoi, and the new take on the history of the fairytale Russia promises to be no less interesting. No matter what, during these nine years the Russian audience has got more or less used to radical opera direction, in no small part thanks to that very Bolshoi Theatre.

Kultura channel: "This opera has a fake reputation of being legendary, grand, far away and not about us. We are trying to step away from this cliché of a history schoolbook and understand what it is actually," the production's director Dmitri Tcherniakov says. For Ekaterina Semenchuk, prima of Mariinsky Theatre, this is a debut at the Bolshoi and the third production with Tcherniakov. "How to get rid of loneliness, how not to be dependent, how to be yourself and at peace with yourself" — the singer asks questions.

Dmitri Tcherniakov and Andri Zholdak were nominated for the 'opera Oscar' — the international prize Opera Awards, the website of <u>Teatr</u> magazine reports.

to the theatre, he is loyal 'to the business, not to persons", follows the state of the corps de ballet and the soloists' creative growth attentively, and is generally reliable. This is what the Bolshoi has lacked in recent years."

"The year 2019 was fruitful for the Bolshoi at the Golden Masks thanks to the epic and scandalous Nureyev by Kirill Serebrennikov; with all its deafening pomp it let male soloists show their talent anew: Vladislav Lantratov, Vyacheslav Lopatin, Denis Savin (8 nominations, 3 awards.) This season will definitely be no less fruitful. In 2020 at least three ballets by the Bolshoi are contender for the Golden Mask: Artifact Suite by William Forsythe, The Winter's Tale by Christopher Wheeldon and Gaîté Parisienne by Maurice Béjart."

Dmitry Vdovin gave an interview to the online publication <u>Newsru.co.il</u>:

"Tell us, please, about international projects of your studio."

"/./. It is very important for young artists from different countries to meet and work together...It is important to share knowledge, tutors, experience and traditions. /./ we have long-lasting relationships with the Washington Opera youth programme, with Italian academies at La Scala, Opera Roma, Florence Musical May festival, Rossini Festival at Pesaro, Osimo Academy. We have cooperated with the Paris Opera Academy, participated in a very interesting and competitive project of Théâtre du Châtelet in Paris that has organised the festival of the world's best youth programmes. We and our colleagues from Metropolitan Opera in New York, La Scala in Milano, Covent Garden in London, Staatsoper in Berlin and Paris Opera's Atelier Lyrique took part in it with concerts." /.../

"On the performance programme in Israel: Did you complete it? What was the principle?"

 $\$ /./ It is out first time here... So it is important to us to present our singers and our work in their full genre scale: we will show arias and fragments from operas

by both Russian and foreign composers. I am very glad that two of our recent graduates — Vasilisa Berzhanskaya and Bogdan Volkov — are coming. They are making impressively successful international careers, and thus you will see or, more accurately, hear not only young artists as they progress, but some of the results which we are aspiring, too."

Choreographer Edward Clug, who is staging the ballet Master and Margarita based on the namesake novel by Mikhail Bulgakov at the Bolshoi, gave an interview to <u>RIA Novosti</u>.

The premiere will be at the New Stage on May 21, 2020.

The choreographer said that the experience of working at the Bolshoi helps him a lot. 'It is very valuable that I have already had the experience with Petrushka at the Bolshoi. Because during this time I have not only familiarised with the dancers but also learnt how the whole theatre mechanism works here. And it helps me very much now. I feel at home here, and that is very important. And I feel deeply responsible for the support I am getting now," RIA Novosty quotes Clug. He pointed out that for him the work at the Bolshoi — one of the best, if not the best theatre in the world — is a dream he couldn't even think of coming true.

All six performances of the premiere series are sold out, and on February 18 one can see Sadko streamed Live on Mezzo TV channel. The cast includes Aida Garifullina who has been working with Tcherniakov continuously recently. One of the world most sought-after mezzo sopranos, the Bolshoi guest soloist, the soloist of Mariinsky Opera Ekaterina Semenchuk: debuts at the Bolshoi as Lyubava in the opera Sadko by Rimsky-Korsakov. In her interview with <u>Rossiiskaya Gazeta</u> the singer told about her work with Dmitri Tcherniakov, chamber music, how it feels to try on the images of tragic heroines and to stay herself; about London's special love of solo concerts.

"For you the previous year started with a premiere of a production by Dmitri Tcherniakov, today's most popular and sought-after opera director. It was Les Troyenes at the Paris Opera."

He knows the text to the last letter of it. It is incredibly interesting to work with him. \angle Lyubava in Sadko is a new role for me which is always interesting and appealing — and a debut in a theatre that is new to mel \angle . Tcherniakov is an amazing artist who has mastered all colours of light and sound, he weaves his fabric expertly, working meticulously on every centimetre. Every note, every turn of the head turn is always a reasonable and important action giving birth to something new. He is notable for his fathomless fantasy, clear and genuine, with the honest view and evaluation of a child along with vulnerability and despotism. \angle .../"






