The famous singer <u>Plácido Domingo</u> performed at the Bolshoi Historic Stage at the invitation of the Bolshoi Theatre.

The gala <u>Bolshoi and Plácido Domingo: Life in Opera</u> place before the World Opera Day 2020 on Saturday, October 24.

The famous singer was accompanied by his friends and colleagues from over the world. The concert gathered a team of outstanding singers including those performing at the Bolshoi Historic Stage for the first time. The world opera stars took part in the gala — Anna Netrebko, Yusif Eyvasov and Ildar Abdrazakov, who performed at the opening of the Bolshoi season in Don Carlo; Pyotr Beczala and Michael Volle, debuted at Bolshoi Historic Stage, as well as young singers - laureates of the Operalia competition founded by the Maestro in 1993 - South-African soprano Pretty Yende, Swedish soprano Kristina Nilsson, and Spanish tenor Xabier Anduaga.

Conductor – the music director of the Bolshoi <u>Tugan Sokhiev</u>.

Plácido Domingo: "These past few days in Moscow have been very special to me and my wife Marta. After several rehearsals, I had the pleasure and privilege to conduct the Bolshoi Theatre Orchestra. Under my baton the Bolshoi soloists, chorus and orchestra performed Manon Lescaut by Giacomo Puccini. This conducting debut of mine took place 45 years after I sang Cavaradossi in Tosca during the La Scala tour at the Bolshoi Historic Stage in 1974. I will continue to enjoy this week singing a Gala concert accompanied by some of my dear friends... Russia has given birth to many of the most legendary composers in history and to many of the great operatic voices of today. I am excited and privileged to be part of this great house's present and its future."

The Bolshoi Theatre and the theatre's long-time partner IMG Artists agreed on the opportunity of further collaboration in this season with the outstanding musician of our time.

The programme of Plácido Domingo's collaboration with the Bolshoi Theatre will be multifarious during the entire season: he will conduct performances of La Bohème by Puccini (February 12 and 14, 2021); Maestro will sing Rodrigo in Don Carlo by Verdi (April 15 and 18, 2021) and appear as Giorgio Germont in La Traviata by Verdi (May 5 and 8, 2021.) He will hold master classes for the Bolshoi soloists and members of the Young Artists Opera Program. And then, on March 9, 2021, Maestro will present another international opera gala for the International Women's Day.

"We feel very happy and privileged to cooperate with such a great musician. It is remarkable that our artists, the Bolshoi Orchestra will have an opportunity to communicate with Plácido Domingo all season through. "He is not only an outstanding performer, a brilliant conductor with a unique talent and experience — he is a man of great culture," — Vladimir Urin.

Alexander Shustorovich (IMG Artists president): "For many years the IMG company has worked together with the Bolshoi Theatre of Russia presenting this iconic company on tours to the audiences of different countries around the world. Today we are glad to become a member of the partnership which makes it possible for the legendary Plácido Domingo to work in Moscow together with the Bolshoi Theatre."

World Ballet Day launched in 2014 and returns in 2020 for its seventh year, showcasing the best of global dance and presenting an opportunity for audiences to go behind the scenes of the world's top ballet companies including the Australian Ballet, Bolshoi Ballet and The Royal Ballet.


Each company was streaming live rehearsals and bespoke insights via their Facebook and YouTube pages as well as via the Tencent platform in China.

2019's World Ballet Day was the most successful year yet, with the event reaching 315 million social media users around the world. World Ballet Day 2020 invited audiences to experience morning class; there were exclusive interviews and access to backstage rehearsals. The Bolshoi Ballet principal dancer Vladislav Lantratov and the first soloist Ana Turazashvili were the World Ballet Day presenters. Anna Nikulina, Olga Smirnova, Artem Ovcharenko, Denis Savin, Alexei Putintsev and the director of the ballet company Makhar Vaziev were the guests of the programme. Also during the livestream, the Bolshoi Theatre gave the floor to Perm Opera Ballet.



This time the Bolshoi Ballet dedicated the livestream hours to Pyotr Tchaikovsky – the theatre celebrates the 180th anniversary of the composer's birth with a festival which started on all the theatre's venues right after the end of the self-isolation period. The World Ballet Day audience saw fragments from rehearsals of The Sleeping Beauty, Swan Lake (choreographic version by Yuri Grigorovich), The Nutcracker (choreography by Yuri Grigorovich), Onegin (choreography by John Cranko); morning classes of National Artists of Russia, the theatre tutors Nadezhda Grachyova and Alexander Vetrov.

On October 27 there was a video-conference meeting of the President's Council for Art and Culture with participation of the Bolshoi General Director Vladimir Urin.

## All participants

In course of the meeting, the Council members discussed the performance of culture institutions during the pandemic, issues of restoration and conservation of culture objects, modernisation of children's art schools, etc.

The Bolshoi General Director Vladimir Urin, addressing the Council members and the president, mentioned:

"...many of our colleagues today in the West do not work at all. It seems that the Metropolitan Opera is going to open its season only in the fall of 2021. A number of theaters are closed. And the fact that today we have been given the opportunity to work is wonderful despite all the difficulties. /./"

In November, the Bolshoi Theatre will hold a festival dedicated to the anniversary of an outstanding dancer, National Artist of the USSR Vladimir Vasiliev. The celebration should have taken place in April, timed to coincide with the National Artist's 80th birthday (born April 18, 1940), but was cancelled due to obvious reasons. In honour of the artist the following productions will be performed at the Bolshoi: November 15, 17 and 18 - Don Quixote, Spartacus and The Nutcracker respectively; November 22 – Lux Aeternum, a production by Tatar Opera Ballet.

October 23, <u>Rossia-Kultura</u> channel – a new episode of the programme Ticket to Bolshoi.

"The New Stage hosted the premiere night of oneact ballets Four Characters in Search of a Plot," the announcement says. "The production consists of works by four foreign choreographers ... performed by the Bolshoi dancers. How did European choreographers get the offer from the theatre to work on new ballets? Why were artists interested in new productions? And how did it feel to begin the ballet season with contemporary choreography? All this in a new episode of the programme..."

## Sad news



Alexander Vedernikov (January 11, 1964 - Ocotber 30, 2020)

Alexander Vedernikov (1964–2020) – conductor, Merited Art Professional of Russia, member of a renowned artistic dynasty – passed on October 30. The musician was only 56.

This virus seems to spare no one. Alexander was a young and vibrant man. It is impossible to reconcile ourselves to his death. He gave eight year of his - as we now know - short life to the Bolshoi Theatre. He had the courage to come there at 37 and to leave it when he realised that his own creative route had to go along another vector. The years of his administration at the Bolshoi were challenging and happy. Alexander knew the Bolshoi Theatre since his childhood. The 21st century was beginning. And Alexander believed that the theatre had to change, that it had to open itself to the world, to develop in this direction - to invite a wide range of directors and singers. He mounted many productions himself. The Fiery Angel by Prokofiev, Adriana Lecouvreur by Cilea, The Flying Dutchman by Wagner in its first version appeared at the Bolshoi for the first time then. He conducted many important Russian operas - Boris Godunov, Eugene Onegin, The Tale of Kitezh, War and Peace. It was with him that the theatre had for the first time in the 21st century commissioned a new opera - Rosenthal's Children by Leonid Desyatnikov became an important milestone in the history of the Bolshoi. All this is and will be in all books

on the history of the Bolshoi Theatre. Yet, sadly, there will be nothing of what Vedernikov could still accomplish at different venues of the world; there will be no new meetings with outstanding conductors and singers, no new scores mastered, no new works commissioned to composers.

And how many things are not in an official biography. His modesty, his risibility, his love of nature, his interest to the most different kinds of art, even his inimitable utterance. On of his favourite words "d'you see?"

No... we don't. And we do not want to. It is too hard to come to terms with Vedernikov passing. Too early...

We send our most heartfelt condolence to family and friends of Alexander Vedernikov.

# Press analysis:

Russian mass media

TV channels, news agencies, printed and online media widely covered Plácido Domingo's performance at the Bolshoi and his conducting debut at the Historic Stage.

A video report by the First Channel:

"Plácido Domingo – King of Opera, also known as a Renaissance man in music – performed at the Bolshoi Theatre after seven months of self isolation. It was then that he came up with a project – to gather first-rate opera stars in Moscow. By the way, appearing on the familiar stage was his conducting debut there, too."

"I spent 10 wonderful days in Moscow and first of all at the Bolshoi Theatre where I had my conducting debut there – 46 years after my debut as a singer which took place at the very same stage. The Bolshoi is doubtlessly one of the grandest theatres I have performed at. It has some special atmosphere. I am deeply honoured to enter this legendary stage. The Bolshoi has a topnotch company, orchestra and choir, and I am proud to enjoy the privilege of performing with them," the tenor said.

"Myself and all invited artists were glad to perform for this amazing audience. It is truly exciting that such an event was organised at this very time, amid a global crisis of historic scale, the crisis which affected all of us and led to the closing of theatres all over the world. Russia welcomed us with incredible warmth. Perhaps only such evenings can make us feel that life keeps going," Plácido Domingo says.

Plácido Domingo told how he learns about contemporary music, what he did during the quarantine, and what parts he would like to sing. The tenor had experienced the coronavirus recently and shared the way the disease has changed his attitude to life.

"You conduct and sing parts in operas. What are you more interested in currently?"  $\!\!\!$ 

"Both: these are two different yet interwoven components to me. I am happy when I conduct, and when I enter the stage I feel lucky to have the opportunity to perform beautiful parts still. \( \lambda . \( \lambda . \)"

"Who, in your opinion, is the best performer and composer in the history of Russian opera?"

"The best composer is always the one [whose work] I am going to sing and fall in love [with it], and I leave the list of performers to critics and music historians. Yet there are two Russian composers most closely related to my career – these are Tchaikovsky and Mussorgsky. ./."

"Can the gala at the Bolshoi Theatre be considered a kind of an overture to your birthday?"

Plácido Domingo: "Of course, I am approaching my 80th birthday in January 2021. Yet I still like it very much how the French say it: 'quatre-vingt' – 'four times twenty'. I feel well and maybe today I love performing music more than ever. That is, I fail to feel that I am turning 80."

"Does Plácido Domingo-baritone miss Plácido Domingo-tenor?"

Plácido Domingo: "A tricky question. Still, I gladly remember my tenor parts. Luckily, I have a terrific amount of records and videos – much of what was done was captured. And I am very happy that I can still sing - now wonderful baritone parts, many of which – for example in Il travatore of La Traviata – I knew well enough and liked being a tenor. The only difference is that I used to nearly

always be the main character before. Now I am either a father, and I like it very much, too, or maybe try on characters like Nabucco or Macbeth who I think are victims of circumstances /.../ And now I play fathers' roles in Rigoletto, Aida, Louise Miller, Jeanne d'Arc as well as in La Traviata and I due Foscari with great pleasure. Although, of course, with time passing each new part requires more and more efforts and time to prepare. /./"

<u>RIAFAN</u> publishes an interview with the opera singer, the Bolshoi guest soloist Hibla Gerzmava: "Opera theatre is beauty in art and music."

"On November 10, at the Moscow Conservatory Grand Hall, you will give a solo concert within the anniversary season. Was the programme scenario altered due to the pandemic?"

"Now it is really impossible to present the programme as it was initially conceived. /.../ due to sanitary restrictions, the concert will run without a break and in a reduced format – one act. And still every performance at the Moscow Conservatory Grand Hall with its unique acoustics is a holiday to me."

"Who will take part in the night together with you?"
"Moscow Virtuosos will come. I am very happy that
in my creative life there is a place for maestro Vladimir
Spivakov who introduced me to his remarkable team
many years ago and that I perform with them from time
to time. Also there will be conductor Vladimir Lande in
the concert, we performed beautifully with him in Krasnoyarsk. I invited Igor Golovatenko to the night - he and

October 23 is the 115th anniversary of the birth of remarkable Soviet conductor and composer Alexander Melik-Pashaev, <u>Orpheus Radio</u> and <u>Kultura TV channel</u> remind.

"He gave all his relatively short life to opera – more than 40 years, 30 of which were spent at the Bolshoi Theatre where he was the head for his last 10 years. /.../ His name is connected with the ultimate bloom of Moscow Bolshoi Theatre which coincided with the middle of the previous century when prominent singers Lemeshev, Vishnevskaya, Arkhipova, Petrov, Andzhaparidze and others were starring there, famous director Pokrovsky was staging productions, and the cast of excellent conductors stood at the pulpit – Golovanov, Khaikin... One of the main figures in this constellation was doubtlessly Alexander Shamilievich himself, especially in the 'golden decade' of his artistic administration of the chief musical venue of the country. /.../"

The online publication <u>Teatral</u> gives details of the special programme Bolshoi to Youth which allows spectators between 16 and 25 years old to buy tickets for a low price. "Now a quota of discounted tickets to the most popular Bolshoi productions will become a regular action /.../" the article says. "The programme Bolshoi to Youth is aimed at forming the young audience. They can buy tickets for 600 roubles (and 100 roubles for certain types seats with restricted view) upon showing their Russian national passport and only one seat and only for themselves. You cannot hand your ticket to another person."

The online publication <u>Kontent Sibir</u> offers its readers an extensive interview with the head of the Bolshoi Young Artists Opera Program Dmitry Vdovin about how selection and education works, about the impossibility of 'standards' in a creative career and members of the Young Artists Program including Maria Barakova, the winner of the 26th Glinka International Singers Competition and the 16th Tchaikovsky International Competition (2019)

Reporter: "When I met Masha [Barakova] last time, I asked her what part she was working on. Suddenly she said that they prefer concerts over opera productions. So she has to prepare many arias from different operas and she likes it more than taking part in just one opera which may take a year to prepare to. The diversity of the programme allows to refine the voice."

Dmitry Vdovin: "Alas. We had different periods in our Young Artists Program. There were ones when we prepared big roles in opera productions, yet now, yes, it is more about concerts. So our young often debut at other theatres including those abroad and not in our native Bolshoi. Yet it is characteristic not only for us, I noted the same at Paris Opera, Metropolitan Opera and other houses. That is about prophets in their own land. Yet the main thing is that we prepare excellent professionals

and virtually all of them, 90 percent, are sought after in the opera world. /./"

November 15, Alexandrinsky New Stage – Leonid Desyatnikov recital, <u>TASS</u> reports. The programme includes the Russian premiere of the vocal cycle Yiddish. The fivepart composition for soprano and string quartet will be performed by Olga Kulchinskaya (Bolshoi YOP member in 2013-2014, Bolshoi Opera soloist in 2014-2017) and artists of musicAeterna orchestra. The 20-minute composition was written in 2018 commissioned by the Jerusalem

String Quartet and presents free transcriptions of Yiddish songs prevailing in Poland between the two World Wars. Pianist Alexei Goribol will open the composer's anniversary night performing themes from Desyatnikov's music to films Moscow Nights, Moscow and Giselle's Mania.

A remarkable dancer, National Artist of Russia Sergei Filin marked his 50th birthday on October 27. In his honour, the ballet La Fille du Pharaon was performed at the Bolshoi Theatre on October 31, Argumenty Nedeli reports in a publication of October 28, 2020 (the scan copy of the article available at the press office.)

"Sergei Filin had an outstanding success in classic and romantic dance combining virtuoso technique, high natural culture, elegance and an unforgettable stage presence making one of the best pages in the history of the Bolshoi Ballet.

/.../ Of particular note is that the beginning of Filin's work as the artistic director of the Bolshoi Ballet coincided with the opening of the Bolshoi Historic Stage after a long time of reconstruction. This was followed with many projects of transferring ballets of the classical repertoire to the Historic Stage including new versions of The Sleeping Beauty and La Bayadere. In this position, Filin consistently implemented the strategy of preserving the heritage of Soviet ballet's 'golden age'. In the years of his directorship ballets Ivan the Terrible and The Legend Of Love by Yuri Grigorovich were revived.

Besides, during Filin's five years of administration ballets by leading contemporary choreographers appeared at the Bolshoi repertoire. Many of these productions remain the jewels of the Bolshoi repertoire. It was these that were broadcast for Russian and foreign audiences during the 'culture quarantine' caused by the coronavirus pandemic."

"On the anniversary of the date of the birth of Galina Vishnevskaya there was a gala in her honour at the Opera Singing Centre named in her honour," <a href="Rossia-K">Rossia-K</a> reports.

"Among the Centre graduates there are Merited Artists of Russia and of post-Soviet countries. The Bolshoi Opera soloist Agunda Kulaeva began her career here. She came to an audition, Vishnevskaya heard her even before the start while Agunda was warming up her voice. A distant acquaintance became a close relationship. /./"

She heard Oleg Dolgov, now a Bolshoi soloist, in the beginning of 2000s and invited him to a tour in Tbilisi. He had learnt a new part and worried very much – Vishnevskaya noted it and replaced him with another singer.

"They called me to her saying that Galina Pavlovna wanted to talk to me. She was like a mother, saying: why, silly boy, goosey, you will sing this part so many times in the future, but you should appear and be 200 percent self-confident. I, she said, don't see it in you now. You will do it, you have it all. You've got a potential, yet a bit later. And so it was," shares the Bolshoi Opera soloist Oleg Dolgov.

On this day artists recall stories related to Galina Vishnevskaya and sing in her honour."

The Spanish international newswire EFE (Republication Telemetro-Panama) reports "The Spanish tenor Plácido Domingo took over the baton of the Moscow Bolshoi Theatre orchestra today, Wednesday (21 October), to conduct the opera Manon Lescaut, by Giacomo Puccini, in his conducting debut on this important stage. "We very much wanted to invite the maestro to Moscow both as a singer and as a conductor," the director of the Bolshoi, Vladimir Urin, told EFE." "Urin recalled that Domingo is not only known as a singer, "but for more than forty years as a great master of the baton", during which he has conducted in theatres as important as the Washington and Los Angeles Operas."

The Spanish international newswire EFE (REPUB-LICATION Clarin.com Argentina) reports "The Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow will honour Plácido Domingo this Saturday (24 October) for a lifetime in opera, a gala in which the Spanish tenor will be accompanied by an exceptional international cast. Life in Opera is the name of the concert that will be held just over three months before Domingo turns 80 in a "phenomenal theatre", as the tenor himself said in brief statements to the media at the Bolshoi after the general rehearsal. The director of the Bolshoi, Vladimir Urin, told EFE that the gala is "a prelude to the celebrations for the anniversary of the birthday" of Domingo on January 21.

"But I also think that in our lives everything has value: friends, colleagues ... and the presence of Plácido Domingo on the Bolshoi stage is always a great emotion, incredible music here and now, and that is the important thing ", he pointed out." "Maestro remembers well, since the La Scala tour (in Russia) in 1974, how much they love him in Moscow," Urin told EFE. Tickets for tomorrow's gala were sold out instantly. "Emotions matter a lot in the theatre. And much more now, when the

world is mired in sad isolation" due to the coronavirus pandemic, Urin said.

The director of the Bolshoi has always defended the Spanish tenor tooth and nail, even after several important stages around the world closed the door on him due to accusations of sexual harassment.

"Domingo is here. That is my attitude about it," Urin stated categorically."

The Spanish newspaper ABC (Spain) publishes an article by Rafael M Manueco who reports "Just three months before his 80th birthday - he will turn 80 on January 5, 2021 – Plácido Domingo will make his debut as a conductor in the historic building of the legendary Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow. It will be today, in a unique performance of the opera Manon Lescaut by Puccini; To this he will join on Saturday as the main star of a great gala organised in his honour under the name Life in Opera. "The unproven accusations of sexual harassment launched against the Spanish tenor by a score of women have closed the door to many theatres across the planet in recent months. This is not the case of the Bolshoi, whose director, Vladimir Urin, declared in September that everything agreed with the Spanish artist would still stand. "The Bolshoi Theatre will not ignore the opportunity to collaborate with this great musician and thus please the audience and ourselves." Referring to the accusations of sexual harassment, Urin said that "such episodes must be proven in a trial as soon as they occur and not after 30 years have passed."

The French online news publication Actu.fr reports about losses in local cinemas due to the COVID crisis. "-70%: unfortunately this is not the sale price of a cinema ticket but the percentage that testifies to the significant drop in attendance at Saint-Malo cinemas. "The -70% attendance are those of the national average. The boat is in good condition, but we lack the oil, that is to say the films to make it work, because very successful films have their release date pushed back," said Loïc Frémont Director of Saint-Malo cinemas. The article mentions "Even live-broadcast operas are also postponed, New York operas are cancelled until May 2021. Instead, we offer Bolshoi ballets with The Lady of the Camellias and The Nutcracker."

won the "Women of Culture 2020" award. Julia Lagahuzère refers to her work with the head of the Bolshoi YOP Dmitry Vdovin with great warmth. One of the questions was, "What was the impact of the Bolshoi Theater in Moscow on your artistic career?" And Julia said, "My meeting with my colleague Dmitry Vdovin, from the Bolshoi Young Artists Opera Program, had a big impact on my career. Indeed, he is one of the best vocal coaches in the world who taught me a lot about voice and also introduced some outstanding Russian singers."


