

EVENTS



• The company meeting took place at 15:00 on September 13, in the stalls of the Historic Stage.

Besides the theatre management, the meeting was presided over by Deputy Minister of Culture of the Russian Federation Alla Manilova, General Director of the Bolshoi Theatre's general sponsor, PJSC Ingosstrakh, Andrey Larkin, Head of the Bolshoi's Privileged Partner Credit Suisse in Russia, Maxim Arefiev and Chairman of the Bolshoi Theatre Foundation Gleb Ermakov.

The meeting began with the traditional screening of a comic film about the Bolshoi's previous season (a special booklet was also issued following the results of the 245th season).

General Director of the State Academic Bolshoi Theatre of Russia Vladimir Urin noted that the Bolshoi experienced an extremely difficult season, and expressed his deep gratitude to the entire team for their expertise, endurance and patience, which allowed the theatre not to cancel a single premiere. The current repertoire remained virtually unaffected, too; neither the audience limitation, nor other difficulties prevented the artists from entering the stage and doing their job.

Six opera and three ballet premieres await the audience in the 246 season.

Renowned director Simon McBurney will stage the opera <u>Khovanshchina</u> by Mussorgsky at the Historic Stage by June 22, 2022. Conductor - <u>Tugan Sokhiev</u>. <u>Lohengrin</u> by Richard Wagner will appear as part

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of cooperation agreements with the Metropolitan Opera (Conductor - Evan Rogister, Director — François Girard) – the premiere will be on February 24, 2022. Don Giovanni by Mozart (Conductor - Tugan Sokhiev) will be staged at the New Stage by Semyon Spivak (the debut in the opera by the head of the St Petersburg Theatre on Fontanka was planned for the 244th season but was interrupted by quarantine measures introduced in spring 2020.) The première is scheduled on November 3, 2021.

The Bolshoi will create three opera productions at Pokrovsky Chamber Stage.

Ocotber 29, 2021 – an evening of two titles — Maddalena by Sergei Prokofiev and L'heure espagnole by Maurice Ravel (Music Director - Alexei Vereshchagin; the Bolshoi continues its cooperation with director Vladislavs Nastavševs after the successful production of the opera Les pêcheurs de perles by Bizet)

March 10, 2022 – <u>Falstaff, ossia Le tre burle</u> by Antonio Salieri (Director - Alexander Khukhlin; Conductor - to be announced)

June 9, 2022 – <u>Linda di Chamounix</u> by <u>Gaetano</u> <u>Donizetti</u> (Conductor - Anton Grishanin, Director - Roman Feodori.)

• The Ballet will prepare three premieres (two of them also postponed from the "pre-covid" season): a ballet to music by Alfred Schnitke Master and Margarita by Edward Clug at the New Stage on December 1, 2021, also there will be a contemporary choreography evening with three new one-act ballets to music by Russian composers — Dancemania by Vyacheslav Samodurov (music by Yuri

Krasavin), <u>Les Saisons</u> by Artemy Belyakov (music by Alexander Glazunov) and <u>Made in Bolshoi</u> by Anton Pimionov (music by Anatoly Korolyov) – July 7, 2022. On April 7, 2022, the Historic Stage will see a new work by <u>Alexei Ratmansky</u> The Art of the Fugue to music by Johann Bach, created especially for the Bolshoi Ballet.

- The Young Artists Opera Programme and Young Artists Ballet Programme will continue their work in the 246 season.
- The Bolshoi Theatre, together with its partners Pathé and BelAir Média, will resume livestreams of the Bolshoi in Cinema project from the Historic Stage: viewers from all over the world will be able to see Spartacus (November 7, 2021), Jewels (January 23, 2022) and La Fille du Pharaon (May 1, 2022.) The recordings of the ballets The Nutcracker (December 19, 2021) and Swan Lake (March 6, 2022) will be shown.
- Deputy Minister of Culture of the Russian Federation Alla Manilova congratulated everyone on the season opening and wished inspiration and new achievements and victories.




The theatre's Chief Conductor and Music Director <u>Tugan Sokhiev</u> recalled the large-scale plans for the beginning of the new season and introduced the new trainee artists: soprano Anna Shapovalova and bass Daniil Akimov, as well as new members of the Bolshoi Young Artists Opera Programme. In 2021, the artists joining the YOP programme are Anna Akishina, Zarina Bagaeva, Nikita Volkov, Bogdan Guenok, Lilit Davtyan, Danil Knyazev, Alexey Kursanov, Albina Tonkikh and accompanist Evgeny Zakharov.

Artistic Director of the ballet company Makhar Vaziev noted that the past season was not only challenging, but also very important: the Bolshoi Ballet opened it with four premieres - an unprecedented event that has given hope to ballet dancers around the world. In a difficult situation, the Bolshoi Ballet proved to be most courageous - emphasised its artistic director, expressing his gratitude to all the theatre's employees.

He reminded the Bolshoi of the ballet's plans for the 246 season and introduced the new artists who had joined the company.

Seven dancers from different regions of Russia who had been admitted to the Young Artists Ballet Programme to study at the Bolshoi (all of them applied for the competition, and all passed the live qualifying round) were also introduced at the company meeting.



the 20th anniversary festival in 2019, this fall it returns to Moscow again.

This year, the festival will host five companies from Germany, France, Italy and Great Britain.

"We present in Moscow teams that we have long dreamed of bringing here.

For the first time we will have a dance theatre from Mainz and Viviana Durante's company. On the playbill, the contemporary choreography stars - Marco Goecke, Sharon Eyal, Eric Gauthier - stand next to the classics: Frederic Ashton and Angelin Préljocaj /... / ", says the artistic director of the festival Irina Chernomurova.

The programme of Dancelnversion-2021 includes: September 21, 22 - The Soul Chain, Staatstheater Mainz, Germany (Helikon Opera); October 2 and 3 - Dying Swans Live Experience, Gauthier Dance Company, Germany (Vakhtangov Theatre New Stage), October 5 and 6 - Vivaldina, Spellbound Contemporary Dance Company, Italy (Helikon Opera); October 19 and 20 - Soyuz, Innovative Ballet Theatre, Kaluga, Russia (Theatre of Nations); October 27 and 28 - one-act ballets: Isadora Now, Furies' Dance, Five Brahms Waltzes in the Style of Isadora Duncan, Unda, - Viviana Durante's Company, Great Britain (MAMT), November 16 and 17 - Swan Lake, Preljocaj Ballet (costumes created by Russian fashion designer Igor Chapurin), France (Bolshoi New Stage).

The exhibition was prepared for the 180th anniversary of the composer's birth, celebrated in 2020. It will run until November 21, 2021.



• The Bolshoi marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Alexander Gorsky (August 6, 1871 — October 20, 1924), a great reformer whose 20 years of service to the Bolshoi Ballet transfigured the company completely.



• In spite of the Pandemic: Muzykalnaya Zhizn Reviews the Results of the Season 2020/2021

Moscow music critics noted:

Olga Rusanova:

The Bolshoi Theatre is ahead of all, distinguished not only by the number (seven), but also by the quality of the premieres. Among them, those made by international teams stand out: Handel's Ariodante (Conductor - Gianluca Capuano, Director - David Alden) and Strauss's Salome (Director - Claus Guth, Music Director - Tugan Sokhiev, coproduction with the Metropolitan Opera).

Person of the Year - in my opinion, in the 2020/2021 season this is the Bolshoi General Director Vladimir Urin, who, in the tough conditions of the pandemic, initiated and implemented an incredible number of projects, including those with the participation of world stars. In addition to the opera premieres listed above, there were also three ballet premieres, including the world premiere of The Seagull (Composer - Ilya Demutsky, Choreographer - Yuri Possokhov, Director - Alexander Molochnikov, Conductor - Anton Grishanin), as well as concerts and performances with the participation of Placido Domingo, Anna Netrebko, Ildar Abdrazakov, etc. As a result, the Bolshoi had one of the best seasons of recent times, with no discounts for exceptional circumstances.

... Bizet's Les pêcheurs de perles at the Bolshoi Chamber Stage staged by Vladislavs Nastavshevs, who took up the opera for the first time and hit the target immediately: the performance turned out to be laconic, no frills, but very meaningful, expressive and interesting.

Speaking more specifically about the 2021/2022 season, I am particularly interested in some Bolshoi's projects - for example, Lohengrin. First, because this is a co-production with the Metropolitan Opera, and second, because it will be the first Wagner at the Historic Stage in many years, again with an international production team. / ... /

Moskovsky Komsomolets: "... The Bolshoi Theatre, which, despite the pandemic, kept inviting production teams from abroad, ended up winning: its 'imported' productions became striking events. And the last premiere - Ariodante by Handel - sounded like a splendid final chord in the somewhat nerdy score of the last opera season, which generally ran under the slogan «Nice and Easy ...", — writes Ekaterina Kretova.

- The Bolshoi started with a performance by Placido Domingo, who made his debut at the Bolshoi Theatre as a conductor in Puccini's opera Manon Lescaut. The performance was inspirational the very presence of Maestro Domingo in the orchestra pit tuned both the audience and the musicians to an enthusiastic mood.
- /... /Admittedly, the Bolshoi managed to maintain this emotional level throughout the season. In March, the magnificent Salome resounded, staged by the Chief Conductor Tugan Sokhiev and the German director Claus Guth. Asmik Grigorian performed the title role - and it was unforgettable both in terms of the musical quality and the director's concept. Never slowing down the pace, the theatre presented Tosca, abundant with stage luxuries up to the golden rain in the finale, over which one could have been ironic to their heart's content, if it was not for the excellent quality of musical performance with the participation of wonderful yet again visiting singers. Well, and the season finale - Ariodante by Handel staged by an international team, in which both Russian singers and guest artists from Italy, Ireland, France, Switzerland, performed excellently under the strict guidance of the Italian maestro Gianluca Capuano and the English director David Alden.

Besides the Bolshoi's evergreen etoile Svetlana Zakharova, it was Olga Smirnova and Ekaterina Krysanova as well as the company principal Artemy Belyakov who became the "main heroes" of the past season. That season, Ekaterina Krysanova received a ballet Oscarthe Benois de la Dance prize - for the classical role of Giselle in the same-name ballet, Olga Smirnova was nominated for the Golden Mask for this role, and her partner in this ballet Artemy Belyakov became a laureate of this prestigious theatre award for the role of Count Albrecht.

Nevertheless, the Artistic Director of the Bolshoi Ballet Makhar Vaziev keeps aiming at rejuvenating the solo cast. And the success the artistic director has achieved is illustrated not only by the unique Italian dancer Jacopo Tissi's performances during the season, or Alyona Kovalyova, who perfectly debuted with him in La fille du Pharaon (as Aspicia) and The Legend of Love (Mekhmene Banu), but also, for example, Benois de la Dance prize. This year Denis Zakharov, a dancer with a filigree and refined technique, was awarded in the Rising Star category. Besides these artists' successful performances, the most intriguing and advantageous 'introductions' in the past season were Dmitry Smilevsky and Ivan Poddubnyak, who impressively performed as James in La Sylphide, and the Russian-Japanese dancer Mark Chino, who performed excellently as the prince in The Nutcracker. Alexei Putintsev also coped with it perfectly, his Kostya Treplev in the premiere of The Seagull made him the best interpreter of this role, thereby consolidating the incredible success he achieved as Beam in Bejart's ballet Gaîté Parisienne." /.../


