• Russian dancer, the Bolshoi Ballet principal, National Artist of Russia Andrei Uvarov marked his 50th birthday on September 28. In his interview with Forbes Life, the current Deputy Director of the Sevastopol Opera Ballet spoke about when he started his dancing career, what he thinks about modern theatre and how his career progressed after leaving the stage. "Andrei Uvarov started performing solo and leading roles while still a student at the Moscow Ballet Academy. During his years on the main ballet stage of the country, he performed the roles of Romeo, Spartacus, Siegfried in Swan Lake and many others, securing his reputation as a prince and a romantic classical dancer.

In 2011, enjoying the status of National Artist and one of the most brilliant principals in the Bolshoi's history, Andrei Uvarov finished his stage career with a performance with Svetlana Zakharova at the opening of the Historic Stage after reconstruction. Having retired, he taught at Stanislavsky Musical Theatre for several years, and then took up theatre management at Sevastopol Opera Ballet." /.../

• September 22 and 23, the Historic Stage - Boris Godunov by Mussorgsky (version and orchestration by Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov, including the Near Kromy scene) This production was first staged at the Bolshoi in 1948 by the «grand style master» Leonid Baratov (1895-1964), together with the Bolshoi Chief Conductor Nikolai Golovanov (1891-1953). 

The Bolshoi Theatre announces World Ballet Day on October 19

• The 8th World Ballet Day will take place on October 19. This year, the main participating companies are the Royal Ballet, Australian Ballet and the Bolshoi Ballet. Close to 50 global companies will take part in the World Ballet Day.

The Bolshoi's three-hour programme will be hosted by ballet soloists Artem Ovcharenko and Ana Turazashvili. Pre-recorded content will include a morning class followed by rehearsals for Orlando, La Bayadère, Don Quixote and La Fille du Pharaon.

"Thanks to World Ballet Day, the world's leading dance companies can once again unite and share with our fans what we do best: dance. It's not just our work, it's the core of our everyday life and the source of our inspiration," Makhar Vaziyev, Artistic Director of the Bolshoi Ballet, said.

• In addition to the Bolshoi, the Mariinsky and Mikhailovsky Theatres will again represent Russia in the World Ballet Day. Perm Tchaikovsky Opera Ballet and Yekaterinburg Opera Ballet will take part in the World Ballet Day for the first time.

The World Ballet Day programme will begin at 11:00, London time (13:00 Moscow time). Royal Ballet will present a rehearsal fragment of their new production Dante Project, directed by choreographer Wayne McGregor to music by British composer Thomas Adès. The Bolshoi ex-principal David Hallberg, who took over as head of the Australian Ballet this January, will give a ballet lesson to the online audience. One can see rehearsals for a number of productions, including Harlequinade and Romeo and Juliet.



• Ticket to Bolshoi - <u>Ariodante</u> - the Rossia-Kultura channel project new film (40'48") (aired on Friday evening, September 24) — available on the Bolshoi YouTube channel:

"The film tells about the preparations for Handel's opera Ariodante premiere which took place at the New Stage in the end of last season ... Director David Alden has staged this opera at various venues around the world since 1994, each time he has managed to achieve a "new sound".

What should opera look like in the 21st year of the 21st century? Is it difficult to shock and surprise the viewer today? Why is baroque music gaining popularity again?

#### This year, the International Competition for Young Opera Singers Operalia will be held at the Bolshoi -October 18-24, the New Stage

Placido Domingo founded the competition in 1993. The goal is to find and support talented young singers at the start of their operatic career. Several hundred applications are submitted to the competition every year. From thirty to forty singers are invited to take part in the competition, based on the results of the preliminary selection. An international jury led by Placido Domingo listens to the recordings of the selected candidates during the two days allotted for the quarterfinals. Twenty participants go to the semi-finals, ten to the final. The quarterfinal and semi-final auditions are held in absentia, and at the final stage of the competition the contestants perform in a gala accompanied by a grand symphony orchestra.

The jury includes outstanding opera specialists, managers and casting directors, and many of the contestants later get the opportunity to take part in productions at the world's leading opera houses.

Valery Makarov, tenor, Bolshoi Pokrovsky Chamber Stage opera soloist since 2019;

• A terrible tragedy happened at the Bolshoi Theatre this weekend. The artist of the Actors and Extras Ensemble Yevgeny Kulesh died as a result of an accident on stage during the performance of the opera Sadko. The performance went on as usual, the scenery was changed in a routine mode - the tragedy came as a complete surprise to everyone. An investigation is currently underway to find out the cause of the incident. The Bolshoi Theatre deeply grieves and condoles with the relatives of the deceased.

Yevgeny Kulesh was 38. He came to work at the Bolshoi in 2002.

"The Dancelnversion Contemporary Dance Festival has opened in Moscow with a tour of Staatstheater Mainz," - Rossiiskaya Gazeta - This fall, the oldest international dance forum in Russia turns 22. Its permanent artistic director Irina Chernomurova, together with a team from the Bolshoi Theatre, prepared an event programme to occupy various venues in the capital, as well as in Kaluga, until November 17 inclusive.

Space became the festival's main opening theme in honour of the 60th anniversary of Yuri Gagarin's flight. "The pervasive theme of the festival ... was space... in its basic, antique meaning - "world", and in its modern meaning - "universe" (The Modern Dance Festival DanceInversion Will Now Be Held in Two Cities).





"This year's Dancelnversion programme has only six titles, and each of them deserves attention if you are ready to fall in love with choreography as a part of today's world, and not just as a phenomenon from the realm of timeless beauties and entities. Dying Swans is this summer's

premiere born during the quarantine restrictions, that paralysed all theatres, and as a kind of response to these restrictions. /.../

Speaking about «highlights», you can find one of the Autumn-Winter 21/22 season's most interesting touring events on the Danselnversion programme. Choreographer Angelin Préljocaj, who regularly turns to classic works of ballet luminaries - Nijinsky, Fokine, Massine - in order to rethink these classics in some expressionist-oriental mood, brings his version of Swan Lake, which premiered this summer in Paris, to Moscow. Preljocaj not only transfers action to the present, but also fits it into the most relevant framework of a newspaper agenda. An oil field is found in the vicinity of the Swan Lake, and greedy tycoons are ready not only to turn people into swans, but to exterminate them completely. Do not be afraid of the journalistic plot - Preljocaj remains one of the most poetic and inventive choreographers of our day, it is just his peculiar sense of humour. November 16-17, 19:00, the Bolshoi New Stage"

 Moskovsky Komsomolets on the production Soul Chain which opened <u>DanceInversion-21</u> (Helikon Opera, September 21-22) "One of the most prestigious contemporary dance festivals, held by the Bolshoi Theatre management, suffered quite predictable casualties this



year; companies from New Zealand, Brazil and Israel fell victims to the coronavirus. The same reason made the festival open a little later than had been scheduled, but immediately with a "shock" and an invigorating dose of dance. /... / The performance was brought to Moscow riding the wave of the sensational success of the Sharon Eyal's ballet Autodance, staged at the Stanislavsky and Nemirovich-Danchenko Musical Theatre last season. 




