

• The Bolshoi Theatre celebrated the <u>World Ballet Day</u> on October 19 online: fragments from rehearsals and interviews with dancers of the world famous Bolshoi Ballet were broadcast live.

The Bolshoi Theatre celebrated the 8th World Ballet Day

This year World Ballet Day (celebrated since 2014) was rolled out in the largest scale in its history: fifty ballet companies took part, including the American Ballet Theatre, the Paris Opera Ballet, the National Ballet of Japan, Cape Town Ballet and others. Keeping to tradition, the main participants of the Ballet Day were the Bolshoi Ballet of Russia, the Royal Ballet of London and the Australian Ballet.

Starting at 10:00 MSK, the Bolshoi threehour broadcast was dedicated to young dancers of the ballet troupe this year. The online audience could watch the morning class of the Bolshoi ballet-master and tutor, National Artist of Russia Alexander Vetrov.

The World Ballet Day hosts were first soloist <u>Ana Turazashvili</u> and principal dancer <u>Artem Ovcharenko</u>.





According to the director of the production, Vladislavs Nastavševs, the performance of Maddalena and L'heure espagnole, bringing together tragedy and comedy in one evening, gives a chance to feel the differences between Russian and French cultures:»Where the Russians see deadly passions, the French see a reason to smile and joke."

Vladislavs Nastavševs:

"It is what men do that matters in Maddalena. Genaro is an artist, Stegno is an alchemist. Both of them are looking for an unattainable ideal.

Maddalena is, in a sense, the embodiment of this ideal. The question is, what happens when a man finds his ideal? It turns out that this is the story of Icarus flying towards the Sun. This is what interests me, and not a love triangle which is way too obvious. Maddalena is more an image than a woman. An image of volatile passion. I would compare her to Medea. The heroine of the ancient Greek tragedy is a woman, a mother, but at the same time she is a demigod. This makes it possible to show a certain higher power that is larger and stronger than us, which suppresses us in the end. The truth is revealed at the last moment.

In Maddalena and L'heure espagnole, the performers wear uniform costumes. Here I went by the time when both operas were written: the beginning of the 20th century. In Maddalena, these are three-piece suits for men, blouses and long skirts for women. In L'heure espagnole, the soloists are dressed according to the early 20th century fashion, and the extras are dressed in flesh-coloured maillots. On the one hand, the costumes should be neutral so as not to draw attention to themselves, not to distract from the vocals, on the other hand, sensuality and flesh, body beauty, close to ballet aesthetics, is emphasised by the bodily colour of the maillots./.../



• The Bolshoi Theatre mourns the death of the singer, National Artist of the USSR, soloist of the USSR State Academic Bolshoi Theatre in 1973-88, artistic director of the Bolshoi Theatre Opera in 1995-99, <u>Bela Rudenko</u>:

"She has lived a great and vibrant life, finding her vocation in music and committing herself to the vocal art. Nature was generous to her: a beautiful voice combined with external beauty and exceptional charm. Such a talent could not be overlooked. It was no surprise that Bela Rudenko was awarded the highest title in the Soviet Union. At the age of 27 she became National Artist of the USSR in 1960.

Having arrived at the Bolshoi at Boris Pokrovsky's invitation in 1972, she worked there for more than a quarter of a century. She was a truly great singer. Her amazing coloratura won audiences in Russia and abroad.

Bela Rudenko sounded equally interesting both in chamber music and in the grand genre of opera. The combination of phenomenal vocal technique with tremendous musical talent made all her interpretations unforgettable. She truly shone as Antonida in Ivan Susanin, as Lyudmila in Ruslan and Lyudmila, Marfa in The Tsar's Bride. Being a caring and courageous person, she always stood up for her aesthetic creeds. In the difficult 1990s, having headed the Bolshoi Opera, Bela Rudenko was ready not only to solve creative issues, but also to look for funding to implement the directors' artistic concepts. A generous soul, she started sharing her own experience early, taking up teaching. During her 40 years of teaching

at the Moscow Conservatory, she has trained many bright and interesting singers, passing on not only her knowledge of vocal technique, but also her love of the opera genre.

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Our condolences to the family, friends, pupils and fans of Bela Rudenko.

 On October 18, Galina Dobrovolskaya, doctor of art history, ballet critic, theatre critic and ballet historian, died at the age of 88

Since 1958, she had worked as a senior researcher at the Leningrad Theatre and Music Institute.

She was interested in the work of the choreographers of the 20th century. Galina Dobrovolskaya was especially fond of the choreographic works of Mikhail Fokin. In her research, Dobrovolskaya had shown his role in the development of ballet art both in Russia and abroad.
