

# Newsletter

May 9th – the concert on the Bolshoi Theatre Historic Stage marked the 73rd anniversary of the Victory in the Great Patriotic War. There were performances by the Bolshoi Opera soloists and members of the Bolshoi Theatre Young Artists Opera Program.

Five years ago, in May 2013, we were lucky enough to record a conversation of the Bolshoi Theatre artists and Great Patriotic War veterans, the ballet dancers Elena Vanke (1925-2014), Faina Efremova-Kuznetsova (1923-2017) and Vladimir Kudryashov, who were honoured guests of the Green Living Room. On Thursday, May 3rd, the press conference about the theatre's plans for the 243rd season took place in the Historic Stage Great Imperial Foyer. The new season will open on September 12th with the performance of the opera Boris Godunov on the Historic Stage.

The Bolshoi Theatre General Director Vladimir Urin, the music director and the chief conductor Tugan Sokhiev, the head of the ballet company Makhar Vaziev and the spokeswoman Katerina Novikova took part in the press conference.

"Announcing plans for a new, 243rd season, I would like to say first of all that today the repertoire of the Bolshoi Theatre includes 26 operas and 37 ballet performances," – Urin said. "Based on these

statistics, we tried to come up with a set of projects that will be implemented in the 2018/2019 season."

### The opera company will present five premieres:

September 29th 2018 – Candide by Leonard Bernstein on the Historic Stage (marking the 100th anniversary of the birth of the composer). Conductor: Tugan Sokhiev. Stage director: Alexei Franchetti. November 3rd 2018 – The Barber of Seville by Gioacchino Rossini on the New Stage. Conductor: Pier Giorgio Morandi. Stage director: Yevgeny Pisarev.

December 12th 2018 – Il viaggio a Reims by Gioacchino Rossini on the Historic Stage. Conductor: Tugan Sokhiev. Stage director: Damiano Michieletto.

March 7th 2019 – Rusalka by Antonin Dvorak on the New Stage. Conductor: Ainars Rubikis. Stage director: Timofei Kulyabin.

May 28th 2019 – Eugene Onegin by Pyotr Tchaikovsky on the Historic Stage. Conductor: Tugan Sokhiev. Stage director: Evgeniy Arye. The performance will replace Dmitriy Tcherniakov's outstanding production, which was a part of the Bolshoi Theatre's repertoire for over twelve years. It was performed in Moscow more than 150 times; it was also shown at all major venues around the world, in France, England, Italy, Japan, China, etc.

The ballet company will present six new productions in the 243rd season:

November 20th 2018 – an evening of one-act ballets: Artifact by William Forsythe to the music by Eva Crossman-Hecht and Johann Sebastian Bach (Russian premiere) and Petrushka by Edward Kluge to the music of Igor Stravinsky (world premiere). The New Stage.

April 4th 2019 – The Winter's Tale by Joby Talbot on the Historic Stage. The choreographer: Christopher Wheeldon. Conductor: Anton Grishanin.

June 13th 2019 – an evening of one-act ballets The Paris Joy by Maurice Bejart to the music of Jacques Offenbach and Symphony in C by George Balanchine to the music of Georges Bizet. The New Stage.

July 19th – the ballet with the working title Krasavin-Samodurov. Music by Yuri Krasavin, choreography by Vyacheslav Samodurov, respectively. The New Stage.

November 11th, the Historic Stage - the gala concert marking the 70th anniversary of the Bolshoi Opera soloist and the People's Artist of the Russian Federation Vladimir Matorin. In addition, the Bolshoi Theatre will makr a number of other memorable dates. On November 20th the performance of The Queen of Spades will be dedicated to the memory of the opera soloist, and a People's Artist of the USSR Zurab Sotkilava (1927-2017), and the gala concert on February 1st, 2019 will mark the 80th birth anniversary of the prima ballerina and a People's Artist of the USSR Ekaterina Maximova (1939-2009). The Bolshoi Theatre will continue cooperation with the Tchaikovsky Concert Hall, where the orchestra and the choir will perform the music by Sergei Prokofiev, Dmitry Shostakovich, Sergei Rachmaninoff and Alexander Borodin.

The large-scale exhibition Museum and Theatre. 100 years together marking the 100th anniversary of the Bolshoi Theatre Museum will be a major exhibition project; it will be held in December 2018 — February 2019 in the New Manege. May 4th, 5th and 6th (matinee performance at 2 p.m.), the Historic Stage — the second series of the premiere performances of the opera <u>The Queen of Spades</u> by Pyotr Tchaikovsky, libretto by Modest Tchaikovsky after the novel of the same name by Alexander Pushkin.

The production by Rimas Tuminas and maestro Tugan Sokhiev had its premiere on February 15th 2018; this is the third time the Bolshoi stages this masterpiece in the 21st century.

The production team for this new version of the opera: director, choreographer — Anželika Cholina, set designer — Adomas Jacovskis, costume designer — Maria Danilov, lightning designer — Damir Ismagilov, chief chorus master — Valery Borisov.

Several important debuts took place during May performances of <u>The Queen of Spades</u>.

May 11th and 13th, the Historic Stage – the ballet by Yuri Grigorovich <u>A Legend of Love</u>. Music by Arif Melikov, libretto by Nazym Hikmet.

This true masterpiece of the ballet of the twentieth century was staged by Yuri Grigorovich at the Bolshoi Theatre in 1965. Svetlana Adyrkhayeva, who danced the part of Mekhmene Banu in premiere shows at the Bolshoi Theatre , as well as Maya Plisetskaya and Nina Timofeeva, who were the first ballerinas to dance this role, set the gold standard for performing this particular role.

The choreography of the ballet was revolutionary for its time: the plastique motifs of the Persian miniatures were merged with the classics, hence there was no more division into dance and pantomime, and even into classical and character dance. This great legacy created by outstanding artists, the ballet, choreographed by Yuri Grigorovich with sets by Simon Virsaladze returned to the Historic Stage of the Bolshoi Theatre in 2014, after it had disappeared from the repertoire for five years.

On May 13th the performance of the ballet A Legend of Love, where Svetlana Adyrkhayeva danced one of her signature roles, marked the jubilee of the People's Artist of the USSR and the Bolshoi Theatre's ballet master-repetiteur, which she celebrated one day earlier.

On May 12th the Bolshoi Theatre marked the jubilee of Svetlana Adyrkhayeva, the famous ballerina, who performed at the theatre in 1960–88, and is now the Bolshoi's pedagogue, with the <u>gala-concert</u> on the Historic Stage.

May 4th, 5th (matinee performance at noon and evening performance at 7 p.m.), the New Stage – performances of the ballet <u>A Hero of Our Time</u>.

The ballet based on the novel by Mikhail Lermontov premiered on July 22nd, 2015. With this production the Bolshoi marked the bicentennial of the poet's birthday, celebrated in 2014. Director — Kirill Serebrennikov, choreographer — Yuri Possokhov. The composer Ilya Demutsky wrote the music on commission from the Bolshoi . A Hero of Our Time was awarded the National Theatre Prize The Golden Mask in 2016 in the category Best Ballet Performance; the choregrapher Yuri Possokhov won the Prix Benois de la Danse for this ballet as well.

Costume designers — Elena Zaitseva and Kirill Serebrennikov. Music director — Anton Grishanin. Lighting designer & Video — Simon Donger.

The ballet A Hero of Our Time consists of three independent parts, based on the chapters of the novel — Bela, Taman and Princess Mary. The leading role of Pechorin is performed by different dancers in all parts.

On May 6th the performance of the ballet A Hero of Our Time was a part of the programme Bolshoi for the Youth. The tickets for this particular show were sold on February 5th – 12th.

Tickets for performances that are shown as a part of this programme are available at special prices -600 rubles and one hundred rubles for the less comfortable seats. They are sold only to young people of 16 to 25 years of age (upon presentation of the passport of a citizen of the Russian Federation).

May 8th and 9th, the New Stage – the opera <u>The</u> <u>Stone Guest</u> by Alexander Dargomyzhsky, libretto by the composer after Alexander Pushkin's play of the same name. The premiere took place on March 11th 2016.

One of the most innovative operas of the second half of the 19th century was staged by Dmitry Belyanushkin; this is the director's third project at the Bolshoi Theatre (he also staged two productions that are popular with children: The Story of Kai and Gerda and The Fables of the Vixen, the Duckling and Balda). Music director – Anton Grisdhanin.

On May 12th the <u>Sofia Opera and Ballet Theatre</u> (Bulgaria) opened its guest performances at the Bolshoi Theatre's New Stage with the performance of the national Bulgarian classic, the opera <u>Yana's Nine Brothers</u> by Lyubomir Pipkov.

Stage director: Plamen Kartaloff. Music director: Georges Dimitrov. Set designer: Sven Jonke. Costume designer: Stanka Vauda. Choreographer: Riolina Topalova. Chorus master: Violeta Dimitrova. The production had its premiere at the Sofia Opera and Ballet Theatre on March 22nd 2018.

Choreographer and lighting designer: Eldar Aliev (the chief choreographer of the Primorsky Stage of the Mariinsky Theatre since 2016). Music director: Boris Spasov. Set designer: Semyon Pastukh. Costume designer: Galina Solovyova.

The production uses the music of Cesare Pugni, Leo Delibes, Riccardo Drigo and Pyotr von Oldenburg.

The premiere at the Sofia Opera and Ballet Theatre took place on November 24th 2017.

Eldar Aliev talks about the creation of the production in the article <u>The Pirate, the Ardent Lover</u> (available on the Bolshoi's website): "This production was created by the people who had long belonged at the Bolshoi theatre — Galina Solovyova (costume designer) and Semyon Pastukh (set designer). In 2005, they worked with Alexei Ratmansky on the production of the ballet Bolt, in 2017 — with Evgeny Arye in the production of the opera The Idiot. Galina Solovieva also designed costumes for Russian Seasons by Desyatnikov — Ratmansky (2008).

### <u>Website Dayton Contemporary Dance Company/</u> DCDC

This company has gained recognition worldwide and stars mostly African American dancers. It was founded in 1968 in Dayton, Ohio, by the outstanding innovative choreographer Jeraldyne Blunden (1940-1999), a former dancer and pedagogue, a laureate of the MacArthur Scholarship; it was an experimental team that represented the most recent developments of the post-modern era. Since 1999, the Dayton Contemporary Dance Company has been headed by Kevin Ward. Currently the company cooperates with world-famous choreographers and has the world's largest repertoire of classical African-American dances, as well as contemporary dance productions. Its repertoire includes works of modernists of the older generation, as well as creations of those who started to stage productions in the 80's and 90's. The list of the outstanding choreographers who worked with the Dayton Contemporary Dance Company during the 50 years of its existence includes Merce Cunningham, Alvin Eiley, Talley Beatty, Bill T. Jones, Jose Limon, Diane McIntyre, Donald McKayle, Bebe Miller and Doug Varon.



Press analysis: Russian mass media

However, our theatre offers an extensive repertoire that has iconic productions by various renowned choreographers, and in most of productions I dance leading roles. Therefore, I consider that I have every opportunity for self-realization. And all this became possible under the roof of one theatre. /.../ I really appreciate the cooperation with Yuri Possokhov, Jean-Christophe Maillot and John Neumeier

AR: What stage costumes do you remember best of all, which designers did you have the chance to work with?

AO: I always admire the costumes designed by Virsaladze ... /.../

AR: In your opinion, what allows the Bolshoi Theatre to be ahead of the curve and, despite some turbulent years, to remain Russia's main brand ?

Artem Ovcharenko: Of course, speaking of the Bolshoi Theatre, most people remember the majestic building, the gilding, the chandelier, and so on. Many want to get to the Bolshoi thinking it is a kind of a museum. However, there are those who come here to get the feeling of the art of ballet. And every year I am convinced that the Bolshoi Theatre is not just walls, but it is all about the people who work there ... The artists create the world fame of the theatre, write bright pages of the Russian ballet's history, pass on knowledge and experience to the next generations.





Eighteen-years old at that time, they were youngsters that survived the war. Today they are from 91 to 95 years old. Going for walks is not the first thing on their agendas".

Elmira Karabanova, a technologist at Lida Holding, speaks about the peculiarities of working with the Bolshoi Theatre, the steps in costume production, the choice of materials, in particular for the opera Un ballo in maschera that premiered on the Bolshoi Theatre Historic Stage on April 20th. Anna Eliseeva reports. "The most interesting of our recent projects is Un ballo in maschera at the Bolshoi that I have already spoken about. The action of opera was set in the 50's, the director was inspired by Hitchcock's work, in particular the film The Birds, and in many costumes the elements of these were more or less present. For example, evening gowns had the imitations of live birds, some were decorated with feathers – everything looked very realistic, incomparably beautiful. Mariana Fracasso, an Italian, was the costume designer; she has worked in fashion houses, for example, Max Mara, -I think that played a particular

role, because the outfits turned out to be very elegant, with lots of details. But it was difficult — we worked two months almost without days off, did a tremendous job. /.../ And now we are working on costumes for the ballet Pharaoh's Daughter, in the style of the Ancient Egyptian era".



— For the year and a half of Laurent Hilaire's leadership the theatre has been focusing on one-act ballets. Quite often there are three ballets presented on one evening. However, it is the tradition of the Stanislavsky Theatre to show multi-act performances, so-called narrative ballets. Is it necessary to make sure the development is continuing in this traditional direction or is it better to let it go, as it goes?

- Everything should be in balance. Dmitry Bryantsev staged many one-act ballets, but they always alternated with long narrative productions. Of course, a long production requires more time and involves greater costs, but you cannot stage only short pieces and narrow everything down to one-act ballets. We are still accustomed to different things. This is Russia. Our viewer and performer is accustomed to expressiveness, to the Russian great heartedness. If it is not required, everything goes into the negative. I must say that the directors of the modern three-piece evenings who bring their productions here, at first notice that it will be difficult for our artists with their classical training and repertoire. And when they leave, they sing praises to us, they say that their productions have never been such a success anywhere else, although they stage ballets all around the world. / ... /

"The gala-concert marking the 25th anniversary of the Kazan Choreographic College will also take place during the festival.

On May 5th the Bolshoi Opera guest soloist Darya Zykova performed at the <u>Strauss-Gala</u> concert together with the Russian Philharmonic Orchestra under the baton of Fabio Mastrangelo on the stage of Dobrograd. The singer performed two concert waltzes by Strauss.


